‘Simi in the Summer’ is upon us, in spades. So far this year the weather has been manageable, breezes lower than usual, winds on shore at 10–15 MPH instead of Santa Anas off the desert at 45 MPH. BUT.....!! The humidity has been higher than normal making it feel much hotter.

Here are some tips for playing in the heat, **SAFELY!**

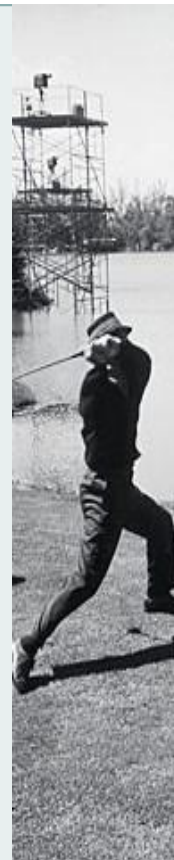
1. White reflects heat, Black absorbs. I don't care if you look bad -ass in your all black golf attire, leave the Johnny Cash look in the closet until the cooler days. Grab a white hat and shirt when the temp is heading north of 85° and you'll feel cooler.
2. The danger of playing in a really hot, windless day is heat exhaustion. Left unabated, it can turn to heat stroke, a deadly condition needing intervention. Symptoms are:
 - Confusion
 - Slurring words
 - Dizziness
 - Fainting
 - Cramps or excessive sweating
 -

If you or your partner shows signs of

heat stroke, it is considered a medical emergency and take the victim to the nearest shade and douse him with water or ice to get his body temp under control. If symptoms don't improve, drive him back to the clubhouse or another air conditioned place to try and cool off.

3. Sweat is the body's A/C unit. Actually *evaporating* sweat is the cooler. If the humidity rises above 50%, your sweat evaporates much more slowly and you feel hotter than our normal 25% percent humidity. Bring artificial sweat in the form of a soaking wet towel or a misting sprayer to wipe or spray your self when you start to feel overheated.
4. Drink tons of liquids, you are losing water rapidly through respiration and sweat. Sports drinks are good as they usually contain salt (a good thing). Unfortunately Alcohol is very bad so hold up on beers until you're in a cooler environment.
5. The “Hat fan” looks effective but is more a conversation piece than a remedy.

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Simi Hills Men's Golf Club Pace of Play Policy

The Men's Club Board of Directors and golf course management have jointly developed a Pace of Play strategy to encourage tournaments to play faster and to improve overall enjoyment of the game. Course management will marshal Club tournaments to promote pace of play. The Board has authorized course professionals to monitor pace of play, give notices and warnings, and penalize those who do not adhere to this policy.

The pace of play goal for Simi Hills is 4 hours and 10 minutes. If you are playing at a pace faster than that, you will not be considered out of position, regardless of any gap in front of you. If you are playing at a pace slower than that, but are keeping up with the group ahead of you, you will likewise not be considered out of position. In both of these cases, neither course management nor marshals will ever approach you.

You may however be out of position if:

- On the first tee, the group in front of you has teed off and you are not yet on the tee.
- On a par three, the green is clear when you get to the tee.
- On a par four, the group in front of you is on the green when you reach the tee.
- On a par five, the group in front of you has hit their third shots when you reach the tee.

Penalties:

On the first tee:

- If you're not on the tee or in the immediate area when the group in front of you has finished teeing off, you are out of position and will be called to the tee. This constitutes your first pace of play notification.
- If you're not on the tee when all other players in your group have teed off, you will be considered out of position and assessed a two stroke penalty.
- If you are not on the tee and the group behind you has hit their first tee shot, you will be disqualified.

On the course:

- If your group is out of position, you will receive a notification that you are being put on the clock and be given 15 minutes to catch up.
- If you have not regained your position after that initial 15 minutes, you will receive a warning that you are still out of position and your group will have an additional 15 minutes to get back in position.
- If you remain out of position after those 15 additional minutes (30 minutes total), each member of your group will be assessed a two stroke penalty and given a final warning.
- If you continue to be out of position for 15 minutes (45 minutes total) after that, your group will be disqualified from the tournament, issued a pro-rated raincheck and will be asked to leave the course.

Your responsibilities:

- Be on time and play ready golf. Nobody enjoys slow play and it is everyone's job to keep up.
- Help your fellow competitors. Watch other players' shots, help search for lost balls, wait to write down scores until the next tee box, and be ready to hit when it is your turn.
- Know the rules, play a provisional ball when appropriate and keep your head in the game.

EQUIPMENT NEWS

EXPANDED GOLF BALL TESTS

There are tests after tests of the big three golf ball manufacturers, Titleist, Taylormade and Callaway, published every winter. Usually pitted against each other. There is a blogging site called “MYGOLFSPY” who went way out of the way to test not just Pro V-1’s or TP-5’s or Chrome balls but many more obscure makers like Maxfli, Inesis, OnCore, Snell, Srixon and others. In fact 35 different balls.

The summary report (Good or Bad) is shown in the chart below. But the real ratings are in the report on their website at:

If you can read and draw conclusions yourself, please feel free to read the results rather than play the on-line video about how and why they did the tests. A bit too much self aggrandizement in the video but the testing is very thorough.

The link above should take you right to the ball evaluation. In the section entitled “DURABILITY AND QUALITY” They show a cut-away of 15 of the balls with stats. Pay attention to the compression ratings in the next section.

Older players talk about how they really love certain balls and when I checked these charts, I

found all of those beloved balls of our elders were very low compression balls. Similar to the craze 10 or so years ago with golfers switching to the Precept “Lady” golf ball (and soon after “Laddie” ball for the homophobic) “Wow, It goes a mile, it’s soft as butter, blah, blah.” Yeah, well it was 80 compression rather than Titleist’s 100+. **Surprisingly:** the testers came down hard on the Callaway offering of “Chrome” balls. They were, or are, very, very soft balls.

Last week I found and hit a Callaway ERC ball, the one with the three stripes around it, and loved the way it felt. I just checked and the ERC is a 73.4 compression marshmallow. The ‘Chrome Soft’ is 86.4 compression. Srixon “Q Star” series balls are 86.2, Titleist “Tour Soft” is 84.7 along with the Volvik and Wilson offerings.

The expensive, high end balls are all over 100 compression with the Pro-V1 at 104.2, the ProV-1X at 110, The Taylormade TP-5 100.1 and the TP-5X at 104.4.

If you are wondering how your ball did, check out the site.

My favorite, the AVX didn’t fair well either.

Oh –Oh! You're on the clock?

Constructive ways to get back in position

Your number one priority is to move ahead more quickly than the group in front of you so you can avoid the “Wrath”.

- ◆ No More Mr. Nice Guy! The informal rules of “honors” is tossed out the window. First on the tee goes. In the fairway, if you can hit and you're on the other side of the fairway from a fellow competitor, indicate to him, so he knows, you will also be hitting and then let it fly. If you are bothered by someone else hitting a shot 150 feet away, then you might be why you are on the clock. Getting angry isn't going to help.
- ◆ Abandon lost balls. It is not a sign of manliness to find balls that you know, “are right here!” The search limit is 3 minutes now, not 5, as before. If you are in a penalty area, drop another ball and hit away. When you're on the clock, 3 minutes is too long to search.
- ◆ Hit a “Provisional Ball” on the tee if you have any doubt at all your first is not findable. NOTE: You cannot hit a provisional ball if you think your ball is in a “Penalty area” go to the spot, search for a minute and then drop.
- ◆ I was at Druid's Glen in Eastern Ireland and had hired a caddie. After we exchanged pleasantries and he determined I wasn't from New York, (They hate New Yorkers) he then ripped all the soft iron, woods and hybrid covers off all my clubs. Seeing I was taken aback he said, “These ting's are fookin' steel, they can take it.” Club Maintenance is less important than a 2-stroke penalty! Taking a minute to return the last used club to it's nest, dress it in it's outfit, turn on the warming jacket so it doesn't get cold and then, with one last longing look to make sure it is comfortable, get in your cart. Jesus!! Get in the fookin' cart!
- ◆ After you hit, immediately get in the cart, with your clubs, towel or whatever and move on. When you stop at the next spot to hit, put your clubs away while your cart mate is hitting.
- ◆ At the same time, be thinking about what you'll need for your next shot. Approximate distance, any tree trouble, interfering hazards. By the time you get to your next shot, you should be able to jump out, grab a 9 iron and after a couple of quick rhythm checks with short practice swings, hit and jump back in the car.
- ◆ Walkers should never be waiting on cart riders. Move safely down the opposite side of the fairway to your ball. Never put your bag down and wait for someone else to fiddle-fuck with his equipment. The cart guys may pass you by soon enough but at least you are not waiting.
- ◆ Green to Tee. When you finish a hole, get in the cart holding all your clubs. Drive to the next tee (which is open of course), and then get out, grabbing your driver. Head to the box and flail away. Your cart mate can write down the scores. You then can return to the cart and put away all the clubs while the next guy hits. Never be putting away clubs while you are holding up forward progress.
- ◆ Reading putts—knock off the 4 way topographical analysis. Read the putt as you approach the green and while others are putting.
- ◆ From the fairway, play to the middle of the green. On the clock means avoid riskier shots. Once you get in position, you can start shooting at pins tucked into awful places.
- ◆ Drop the deliberate routine. If you have a set routine to make your shots and you can't modify it, then you are the problem. Remember, this new policy penalizes the entire foursome, not just the deliberate player. Have your club figured out before you even arrive at the ball, shrug your shoulders a couple of times and swing slow and smooth.

If you do these things, you will be back in position within 1 hole which is about 13 minutes and avoid the penalty or disqualification.

July Individually Flighted Home Tournament

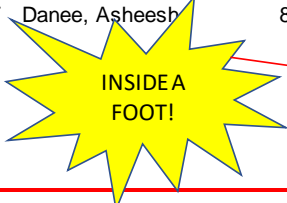
July 21, 2019

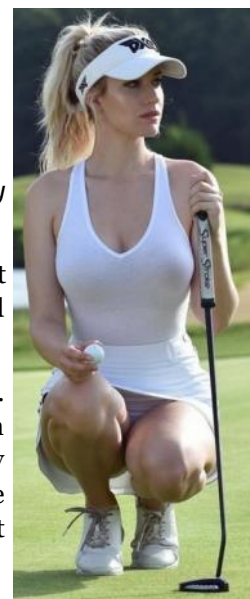
“I’m leaving.....you behind”

This tournament is an individually flighted event and **everyone is invited to play**. It has it's own prize fund and special events and pays out just like any other home tournament. It ALSO acts as the first round in our club Championship tournament, a 54 hole 3 day event. Because of that fact, all players in this qualifier will play to their L.I. (lowest Index) in the past 12 months or your "tournament handicap index" if you have been adjusted. Your L.I. (shown as "Low H.I.") is shown on your GHIN screen if you login at the course or online. Rounds two and Three of the Club Championship will be held Saturday, September 14th and Sunday, September 15th for those players who did well enough in the qualifier to move on. To qualify:

2. All eligible Members must be within eight (8) strokes Gross or eight (8) strokes Net of the leader or in the top 16 Gross or in the top 16 Net, plus ties, whichever is greater, after the Qualifying Round.

RENEWING YOUR MEMBERSHIP
